Village Hall and Village Market

The Hall Committee has to raise approximately £8,000 a year just to keep the Hall open. This is to cover costs such as cleaning, electricity, water, insurance, general repairs etc. The

money for this comes from the hirers of the Hall and not from any fund raising activities that the Hall Committee also undertake.

Fund raising activities are purely to bring money into the Hall to pay for the refurbishment programme that is underway.

It is important to the Hall Committee that the fund raising activities it runs are successful not only with attendance but also for the money raised

Recent tribute bands organised have not been performing to capacity audiences with many of the attendees coming from outside the village.

The Village Market (formally the Farmers Market) is an opportunity to generate between £120 and £200 per month for the Hall Fund raising depending on attendance.

In recent months we have seen the number of stall holders reach record numbers with a terrific variety of goods on sale and although we recently lost the Butcher (although are hopeful this is only a short term problem) the number of people coming to the market has gone down

For any market to succeed it is imperative that the public support it as otherwise we will lose the support of the stall holders and the event will fold.



High Halstow Cricket Club

Last month, I referred to a notebook passed to me by John Durling, who had played for the club in the 1940's and 50's. The following notes, written no later than 1954, cover the history of the cricket club upto and including World War II. The post-war extract follows next month. In both instances there are many gaps, which I would like to fill from the direct knowledge of any reader who remembers those days or has family records of them.

In 1885 there was a small club running in the village, which had their ground on Rayner's Meadow, now the farm's yard. It was not until 1895, ten years later, that the Rev T.W. Longfield formed the present club backed by other members of the village. The ground was then changed to the Rectory Meadow where it is to the present day. Boundary lines have altered considerably during the years. The boundary then was between two pools, the one in the wheelwright's yard and the one in the Rectory garden.

It was not until 1900 that the club really found its feet. There were only 6 or 8 matches a season played at first mainly against St Marys, Stoke, Grain and, later, Higham. Since 1900 the club steadily grew and was quite good by the time Mr Kemp was headmaster at the School.

Over the years, the boundaries of the ground have gradually worked away from the Rectory Garden until 1939, when the pitch was in the middle of the field. The old, original boundaries had by this time been taken over and a flourishing tennis club was now being run.

1939 saw the beginning of World War II and for nearly 3 years the ground was neglected, But in 1943 got the club together again. Fixtures were few were mainly between local army units. The war first bought Sunday cricket to the village which has now become very popular.

Playing records for this period only begin in 1939, and show those players who scored 50 or more in a game and those who took 7 or more wickets in an innings. Many of you will recognise the names:

The colts (under 17 and younger) are at King's School on every Sunday between 3 and 5 in the afternoon, whilst the adults are at Hoo School between 7 and 9 on Thursday evenings. All players, and prospective players are urged to attend. We have recently secured significant sponsorship from a major international company, which will help with necessary equipment supplies and maintenance. Further opportunities of support, particularly from local companies and individuals, are readily available to those interested in keeping cricket alive in the village.

Resume of the Parish Council Meeting 9th January 2013

The main discussion at the meeting held on 9th January was about the budget for the year from 1st April 2013 and the amount of money (called the precept) that the Parish Council needs to raise through the council tax system for the year. The Chairman of the Finance Committee has written a separate article about this, which will be found elsewhere in this issue of High Halstow Times. This will therefore be a short résumé of the first meeting of 2013. The Parochial Church Council asked for a grant towards the repair of the path to the church. This was granted subject to sight of their accounts. These have now been received and if agreed by councillors, the grant will be ratified at the next meeting.

The closures on the gates to the fenced play area on the Recreation Ground need repair again. It's not that long since they were last repaired. For the playpark to pass the annual RoSPA safety inspection, there must be functioning self-closing gates at 2 points in the fence. We would ask users of the playpark to ensure the closures, which have hydraulic mechanisms, aren't forced in any way and are allowed to work as intended. Each time they have to be repaired, the cost falls on all of you. This time we've had one quotation for over £1,000, which may not be as expensive as it looks in view of the hydraulics involved. Other quotes and other methods of repairing the gates so that they meet safety requirements are being investigated.

Finally, Medway Council has offered us a couple of bus shelters that are being removed from Halling. There will be some costs involved, but not as much as the purchase and installation of new shelters. One will replace the shelter at Eden Road, the other will be stored for the time being until a site is agreed on. The next meeting is on Wednesday 13 February 2013 at 8 pm in the Memorial Hall. Everyone is welcome.

ST MARY HOO PARISH NEWS

Hi. Just a short update on Parish news and projects. As another festive season passes by we hope that everyone had a happy and peaceful time. The weather has not been too kind but spring is not far away and we shall all be preparing for Easter before we know it.

Best wishes and congratulations to Terry and Jackie Ballard on the reopening of the Fenn Bell public house in late December. We wish them every success for 2013.

Phil Filmer, our Ward Councillor dealing with front line services, attended the St. Mary Hoo Parish Council meeting in September to hear resident's concerns over speeding traffic between Fenn Corner and Allhallows. As a result Ian Wilson of Medway's Highways dept. has commissioned an assessment and consultation to consider setting a local speed limit of 50mph and a possible further reduction to 30mph at St Mary's Cottages. Although difficult to enforce it is hoped that, if imposed, responsible motorists will comply and help to make the road safer, especially for cyclists and pedestrians. Phil has also been involved in investigating the flooding of the road at the junction of Fenn Street and Newlands Farm Road which has caused traffic issues and access problems outside Cliffe Auto Repair workshop. Highways dept. have identified a blocked or damaged pipe within the southern side culvert and have committed to link the south and north ditches by a new pipeline to encourage proper drainage. Preliminary clearance of the north ditch has taken place to identify the best location for the pipe and we hope to hear soon on dates and traffic management plans for the work.

Our maintenance plan for the Parish amenity areas has been hampered by weather conditions but we hope to be back on schedule soon. Discussion has taken place on defining and improving the pathways within the nature reserve at Newlands Farm Road. Please contact myself or Roxana, our clerk, if you have any ideas, concerns or information. We will be pleased to hear from you or indeed see you at Parish Council meetings.

The next meeting is scheduled for 26th March at 7.30pm in the Fenn Bell PH function room.

Special thanks to our volunteers who help with inspecting and reporting on footpath conditions and in distributing the magazines. My personal thanks also to the councillors for giving their time to help the community, to Phil Filmer for his assistance on the traffic issues and of course to our clerk Roxana for her direction and service. Meanwhile we wish you a happy, safe and prosperous 2013. Best wishes

Changes to Concessionary Bus Passes

Changes are being made to the way concessionary bus passes for older and disabled people are issued in Medway. The English National Concessionary Travel (ENCT) Scheme was introduced nationally nearly five years ago and provides free off-peak travel on local bus services.

In the past Medway Council has renewed passes every five years. This will be change to a staggered system in future, starting with passes due to expire on 31 March. These will have variable expiry dates of between three and five years. The aim of this change is to reduce the number that need to be replaced at any one time, so instead of all passes being updated once every five years that will change to three, four or five years in length.

It will also help the council to keep its record of pass holders up to date to reduce the risk of fraudulent use and the cost of producing cards for people who, for example, may have moved out of the area. Medway Council has already contacted all existing pass holders asking them to confirm their details ahead of issuing the new passes. These can be used as soon as they are received. Old passes should be destroyed.

The vast majority of the 39,000 people contacted last year have responded leaving a shortfall of around 6,000 who will need to contact the council if they wish to continue taking advantage of free bus travel from the start of April. A poster campaign will launch at the end of this month reminding older and disabled residents to get in touch if they have yet to receive their concessionary bus pass.

Anyone who is expecting a new pass but does not receive it by the beginning of February should call Medway Council on 01634 3333333.

Cllr Phil Filmer, Portfolio Holder for Frontline Services, said: "By writing to all existing pass holders asking them to confirm details has meant that our records are as accurate as possible. This means the correct passes will be received in adequate time before any existing passes expire at the end of March. So, existing passholders will not suffer any inconvenience as a result and will be able to continue to travel for free on bus services in Medway."
