
Auction – 14th March

BIBLE CAKE RECIPE

- 1. 8oz Judges V verse25 (last clause)
- 2. 8oz Jeremiah VI verse 20
- 3. 1 Tablespoon 1 Samuel XIV 25
- 4. 3 off Jeremiah XVII 11
- 5. 58oz 1 Samuel XXX 12
- 6. 8oz Nahum III 12 (chopped)
- 7. 2oz Numbers XVII 8 (blanched & chopped)
- 8. 1lb Kings IV 22
- 9. Season to taste with II Chronicles IX 9
- 10. A pinch of Leviticus II 13
- 11. 1 teaspoon of Amos IV 5
- 12. 3 tablespoons of Judges IV 19

Method: Beat nos. 1, 2 & 3 to a cream, Add 4 one at a time, still beating, then 5, 6 & 7 and beat again. Add 8,9,10 & 11 having previously mixed them and lastly no12. Bake in a slow oven for 1.25 hours, or until skewer is clean.

Oven temps. 130 -140 C, 200 - 275 F, Gas Mark 0.5 - 1

Note: leaven means baking powder



A letter to the complainers. Why is it that people move to our village and want to change things?

If you buy a house/bungalow close to the 'Recreation Ground', you also benefit from a number of nearby facilities, such as: Two Village Halls Cricket Club and Field A good village Pre-School and Primary School A village pub A Beautiful Church (with bells)

High Halstow Recreation Ground is used by football teams at weekends and once or twice a year by local schools for 'Games Days', as well as special events such as summer fayres. There are good facilities for the children of all ages who live in this village. The little ones can enjoy the swing park, and an outside Gym for the older ones (plus adults).
