## High Halstow Hikers

For our February walk we chose to start and finish at the Dirty Habit, a 12C pub at the top of Hollingbourne on the Pilgrim's Way. The route was (meant to be) about 7 miles and was selected as likely to be as good underfoot as can be expected after the rain and flooding this winter. While we stayed on the guided route this was the case. The most impressive section of the walk took us through the grounds of Leeds Castle. Extraordinary that a public footpath should provide such an excellent view of what is often termed the "Loveliest Castle in the World"! It certainly looked splendid in the morning sun. The route then took us west to Fulling Mill Farm where the flooded stream added to the attractiveness of a very well kept neighbourhood, at least for those of us not having to suffer the consequences of the flooding. Our route back was initially on good tracks as we headed for the Pilgrim's Way along the bottom of the Downs but an unplanned deviation that took us into Snarkhurst Wood created what most of the walkers generously termed an adventure. This led to muddier boots, wearier limbs and an enhanced thirst and appetite than expected. For 14 of us a very nice roast lunch and traditional ales back in the Dirty Habit managed to satisfy the last 2 of these. On Sunday 9th March starting at 10.00am we will do a local walk, starting from Sharnal Street and along the west bank of the Medway and Stoke Saltings. We will meet at the east end of Sharnal Street where there is on street parking. This is close to the roundabout on the A228 at the bottom of Christmas Lane. Coming down Christmas Lane you come off the roundabout in the direction of Grain and, with care, just 30yds later turn right across the dual carriageway. The walk is between 5 and 6 miles and is almost entirely flat but clearly some muddy patches can be expected. ## Allotments



# Newly discovered map sheds light on the history of High Halstow

A hand drawn tithe map has recently been discovered in the loft of the Rectory. The map was drawn in 1843 and is a copy of an original drawn in 1839. It gives a wonderful snap shot of life in the village almost 180 years ago. The main village which presently has over 400 houses consisted of less than a dozen including the present red Dog public house. The only road that has a name on the map is Clinch street. Many of the areas around the village that get flooded in heavy



rain can be seen on the map marked as a pond. There is one corner of my front garden that is always a little damp can be seen as one of these ponds, which explains a lot. The map measures 8 foot long and 6 foot 6 inches wide and is pasted onto a cloth background. To give parishioners a chance to view the map, before it is put in storage in the Medway archives, it will be mounted on the wall in the church over the Easter period. Dates and times in the next HH Times. An beautifully illustrated old Cradle roll giving the names of children baptised in the church was also found. This dates from what we think is the late 1950's to the mid 960's was also found and a copy of that will be on permanent display in church soon. If you were born here in the 60's maybe your name is on it. Many of the names do look very familiar.


