The site is the current location of the Royal School of Military Engineering (RSME) and due to the RSME's planned relocation to Bicester, has been deemed surplus to the MoD's requirements. Development at Lodge Hill, Chattenden, has the potential to create in the region of 5,000 new homes, together with community facilities and new employment opportunities over the next 20 years.

Retrospective application for change of use from grazing land to residential land for siting of three mobile homes and one touring caravan with the construction of a utility unit.

Following a refusal of planning permission by Medway Council, an appeal has now been made to the Secretary of State, via the Planning Inspectorate, in respect of the above mentioned application. The appeal is to be decided following an exchange of written statements and an Inquiry will be arranged for an Inspector to determine this appeal.

Any representations you made to the Council when the application was originally being considered will automatically be sent to the Planning Inspectorate. Should you wish to comment further on the appeal, please write in triplicate by 14th April 2009 (quoting the Inspectorate's appeal reference number above), to The Planning Inspectorate, Room 307, Kite Wing, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Bristol, BS1 6PN.

If the Inspectorate receives representations after the deadline they will not normally be seen by the Inspector and they will be returned. You are able to obtain a copy of the Planning Inspectorate's booklet "Guide to taking part in planning appeals" from this Authority. If you want to receive a copy of the appeal decision you must request this when writing to the Inspectorate.

HHPC Comment: It is suggested that anyone who originally wrote to Medway Council should consider the points they made in their original letter and whether there are any further/different comments which should be sent to the Planning Inspectorate. Anyone who didn't write with their comments originally are encouraged to do so.

European Health Insurance Card

Check the renewal date on your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). More than three million will have expired by the end of March, leaving many travellers at risk of hefty medical bills. The EHIC means that should you fall ill or have an accident you will get reduced costs or free state-provided healthcare in most European countries, currently 3.3 million people have an out-of-date card and will not be covered for basic medical care.

Renew your EHIC—The EHIC can be renewed online or over the phone and will be delivered within ten days. It can also be renewed up to six months in advance of expiry. To renew or obtain an EHIC, call the EHIC Application Line on 0845 606 2030 or apply online at www.direct.gov.uk

RESUME OF THE MEETING HELD ON 11 MARCH 2009

The March Parish Council meeting was given a presentation on the Community First Responder scheme by Steve Joyce, our local responder. The idea behind this volunteer service is to provide a basically trained person to attend an incident and remain until the ambulance or paramedics arrive. At the moment, Steve shares one responder pack with a colleague from Wainscott. After Steve's explanation, the parish council resolved to contribute towards a pack that would remain in the parish.

The ditch on the Recreation Ground remains a problem for residents of Goodwood Close. Another site meeting with an expert from Medway Council will be sought. Subject to approval, the playpark will now benefit from funds made available to Medway Council for play areas in the district, which should mean we will be able to replace all the old equipment and lay a safety surface to modern standards. Consultation will be undertaken before decisions as to the type of equipment are made. The Recreation Hall committee asked for "no ball games" signs for the car park. It was agreed these will be provided if they can be fixed to the hall.

The footpaths in the parish continue to be monitored by our Footpaths Officer, Charles Crouch and by Cllr Ray Collins. Ray recently spent time with the new Public Rights of Way Officer at Medway Council, looking at the footpaths on the land at Buckhole Farm.

It was agreed to order two bus shelters to replace two of the existing three metal ones. Unfortunately the funds are not available to replace all three at one time. The new ones will be of timber construction, which councillors feel is more sympathetic to a rural situation.

All present were reminded of the Annual Parish Meeting to be held on Wednesday 8 April at 8.00 pm in the Memorial Hall. Although chaired by the Parish Council Chairman, this is YOUR meeting and gives all parishioners the opportunity to raise any matter they like for future consideration by the Parish Council. Refreshments will be provided. Do come along, meet the councillors and other residents and have your say.

Appeal

You may have heard of Blythswood Care, a National Charity with a local depot on the Medway City Estate. They combine the Christian message with practical help for those in need at home and abroad, regardless of their political or religious beliefs or ethnic origins.

Last year the facility at Medway coordinated 28 juggernaut loads of aid mainly to Romania, Serbia and Hungary. However, like most of us, they seem to be feeling the effects of the recession and are seeing a reduction in the amount of donations received. Phil Shorthouse, Corporate Aid logistics manager sates 'A major crisis has hit us, we have an acute shortage of clothing. This means that instead of normally being able to send six aid shipments this year we have only been able to send two, and only one of those had clothing in it. We are in desperate need of clothing for all ages as well as bedding and household linen'.

Garden Club


