THE FIGHT TO SAVE DEANGATE RIDGE

CABINET VOTES TO CLOSE DEANGATE

Since the Cabinet meeting of 6th February 2018 Deangate Ridge golf course has been under threat of closure. The very short 5 day notice of this meeting and the inadequate non compliant nature of the report Cabinet considered sparked wide spread public unrest and an unprecedented call for "freedom of Information" requests at Medway Council.

At subsequent Parish Council meetings of Hoo and High Halstow a resolve to challenge the Cabinet decision was agreed (High Halstow PC resolved that "Halstow Parish Council is wholly against the closure of Deangate Ridge Golf Course.").

A protest group was also separately formed called "Deangate Community Partnership" (DCP)

A petition signed by 3847 people was submitted to Medway Council triggering the decision to be referred to the Regeneration Culture and Environment Overview and Scrutiny committee specially convened on 12th March 2018.

At that meeting parish councilors and members of the public were allowed to present the case to postpone the decision to close Deangate Ridge. The Committee resolved, after much deliberation, to refer the decision back to the Cabinet to consider the decision again in the light of evidence put forward.

The Primary reasons Cabinet gave to close Deangate were losses averaging £200,000 per year over the last seven years and no prospect of turn around despite significant efforts by officers.

Deangate Community Partnership whilst agreeing that losses of £200,000 were of course unsustainable, showed that the report produced to substantiate this claim were legally non compliant, inadequate in-accurate and un-evidenced to such an extent that they could have been produced to substantiate a predetermined outcome. They further claimed that to close this facility required extensive public consultation.

Following the Overview and Scrutiny committee decision the DCP entered into talks with representatives of a national sports providing Charity well know for running Golf courses and sport facilities for communities on behalf of local authorities.

They together produced a plan of action to take over the running of Deangate for the benefit of the community and no cost to the council and to provide the council with a substantial monthly contribution to its purse.

This was submitted to Medway Council under the Localism Act 2011 as an "Expression of Interest". Further to this the group also submitted a request to have Deangate registered as an "Asset of Community Value" under the same Localism Act.

On 28th March the Cabinet again considered to close Deangate, the previous decision to close was upheld and move forward from 31st March to the 14th April. Cabinet were however interested in the "Expression of Interest" submitted by the DCP and instructed officers to investigate proposals put forward.

This decision is un-acceptable to DCP as closure of Deangate at the beginning of its most profitable period does not make its future viable as closure predicates future success of the business during any investigation by officers into viability and due diligence.

Time now allows no other choice other than to take legal action to postpone closure. To this end DCP have been collecting pledges of financial help ahead of crowd funding.

When discussing this at the Parish Council meeting, we all agreed it was a lovely gesture and wondered if any others had family or personal reasons and felt they would like to make a contribution, the option is there.

KENT POLICE RELEASE WARNING

False claims of Telephone Preference Service:

Fraudsters are cold-calling victims, falsely stating that they are calling from one of the well-known UK telecommunication service providers. They call victims claiming to provide a 'Telephone Preference Service' - an enhanced call-barring service, which includes barring international call centres.

The fraudsters ask victims to confirm/provide their bank account details, informing them that there is a one-off charge for the service. Victims instead see monthly debits deducted from their accounts, which they have not authorised. The fraudsters often target elderly victims.

In all instances, direct debits are set up without following proper procedure. The victim is not sent written confirmation of the direct debit instruction, which is supposed to be sent within three days.

On occasions when victims attempted to call back, the telephone number provided by the fraudster was either unable to be reached or the victim's direct debit cancellation request was refused.

During 2017, there were 493 Action Fraud Reports relating to this fraud.

Protect yourself:

There is only one Telephone Preference Service (TPS). The TPS is the only official UK 'do-not-call' register for opting out of live telesales calls. It is FREE to sign-up to the register. TPS never charge for registration. You can register for this service at http://www.tpsonline.org.uk.

You will receive postal confirmation of genuine direct debits. If you notice unauthorised payments leaving your account, you should contact your bank promptly.

Always be wary of providing personal information, or confirming that personal information the caller already claims to hold is correct. Always be certain that you know who you talking to. **If in doubt hang up immediately.**



Resume of Parish Council meeting 14 March 2018

The March 2018 meeting was attended by 8 of the 9 parish councillors, Martin Andrews having a family commitment. There were 3 members of the public in attendance.

There was a planning application for the conversion of a barn at Buckhole Farm to a dwelling, to which there was no objection. All parish councillors of the 11 Medway parish councils had been invited to a briefing on the Medway Local Plan on 20th March. The Local Plan sets out Medway Council's planning strategy up to 2035 and must take account of Government guidelines, including the number of dwellings required. The Government has used a different methodology from Medway and the number is likely to increase from 29,500 to 37,000 (some of these have already been built). The draft plan is open to public consultation, which finishes on 16th May. You can view this and comment on Medway Council's website. We are holding a special meeting on 18th April. Look on the Parish Council's website for further details. The Parish Council is proceeding with its decision to create a Neighbourhood Plan for High Halstow and at the time of going to print the Steering Group had already met twice and discussed the way forward. An update on the Neighbourhood Plan and Deangate Ridge is elsewhere in this issue.

It was decided that the High Halstow Times advertising rates would increase from £10/eighth page to £11 and pro rata. Allotment rents for a full plot will increase to £25 from 1st April, but will be invoiced in arrears (Allotments Act 1908) in March 2019. The budget for 2018/19 was then approved.

The commemorative seat in the churchyard, originally installed by the Parish Council is in a sorry state and it was agreed to replace this. Research is being done on types and prices. It was also agreed to install a litter bin by the bus shelter outside the Recreation Hall. The remaining new bus shelters, for Christmas Lane by the roundabout and on the A228, Sharnal Street are due to be installed immediately after Easter.

Ray Collins reported that a resident connected with the Royal Engineers had generously donated the price of 2 of the new commemorative trees planted at the far end of the Recreation Ground and we would like to thank him for this.

Mick O'Hanlon reported on research he has done on the viability and cost of CCTV being installed at the entrances to the village. One of the contacts he has made will be asked to speak at the Annual Parish Meeting.

There will be alterations to the dates for the June and August meetings, due to commitments that the new Clerk already had before her appointment. You will be notified of the new dates in due course. The next meeting will be the Annual Parish Meeting and will be held in the Memorial Hall at 8pm on 11th April. This is your meeting and we would like to see as many of you as possible there. All village organisations are invited to come along and give a report on their activities over the past year.

HIGH HALSTOW NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

On Wednesday 21st March 2018 the Parish Council's newly commissioned Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, consisting of parish councillors and residents met for the first time. On behalf of the Parish Council the Steering Group will consider a community-led planning framework for guiding the future development, regeneration and

New Local Plan and will run to the middle of May this year. The Plan will cover the development of Medway from 2012 up to 2035 and includes the provision of some 29,000 new homes, regeneration and economic development across Medway. The

Plan must be sustainable and approved by the Secretary of state before it becomes Statutory.

Medway have put forward 4 scenarios for development within Medway and all 4

include the development of up to 12,000 homes on the peninsula. One of the scenarios takes account that government may require Medway to use the new 'Standard Method' for calculation numbers of houses introduced for Local Authorities who have not submitted a Plan by April this year. The 'Standard Method' would increase the housing allocation to some 37,000.

There will be an opportunity shortly for you to take part in this the second consultation on the Development Strategy and there will be further consultations before the Plan is finished. Dates

and times for consultation will be publish as soon as available on the Parish Council notice boards, its web site



(www.HighHalstow-pc.gov.uk), social media and in the High Halstow Times.

Deangate Ridge

The situation at Deangate Ridge remains fluid. On the 12th March 2018 the decision to close Deangate was paused after a successful "Calling in" to the Overview and Scrutiny Committee. At the time of writing (Monday 25th March) the newly formed Deangate Community Partnership had just submitted to Medway Council an Expression of Interest under the Localism Act of 2011 in partnership with a National Charity providing sport facilities for communities, offering to run Deangate at no expense to Medway Council and further offering to contribute a substantial monthly contribution from the Council purse. The submission will be presented to Medway ahead of the Cabinet meeting scheduled to take place on the 28th March at Gun Wharf. Further legal action is pending.


