# High Halstow Hikers

Our April walk was a new venture with 16 of us walking through 3 of the London parks. We travelled by train from Chatham to Victoria very economically at £6.40 each because of being in a group. From Victoria we walked across to the front of Buckingham Palace where the crowds were gathering for the 11.00 changing of the guards. A short walk through St James Park included views of many exotic water-birds including pelicans. The Mall is shut to traffic on a Sunday so we strolled along that past Clarence House and into Green Park. Our route across the island of Hyde Park Corner allowed a view of numerous memorials to those fallen in battle. The weather for the day was excellent, just about the first good day of Spring, and meant there were many boats out on the Serpentine and a very long queue for those wishing to join them. We stopped for a picnic lunch at the memorial to Diana, Princes of Wales where Ron got much wetter than he had expected, courtesy of one of many youngsters enjoying the stream. After lunch we walked past the Albert Memorial through part of Kensington Gardens and up to Kensington Palace before turning back to the Round Pond and the ornate Italian Gardens at the northern edge of the park. Our route back to Victoria was along the whole of the north-side of the Serpentine. We had about 4 hours in London and walked about 6 miles with virtually no concerns with traffic and saw several of London's iconic sights. The enthusiasm of the group at the end of the day makes it seem likely that we will return to the "smoke" before too long.

Our next walk will be on Sunday 12th May from Brenchley and is described as "Iron Man of Brenchley" in the AA guide because this village was at the heart of the once thriving iron industry that Kent once had. The walk starts from Brenchley village car park which is reached by taking the A228 from West Malling continuing along Seven Mile Lane eventually turning left onto the B2017 (Badsell Road). After 1 mile turn right onto B2160 (Maidstone Road). After another 0.4 miles turn left onto Chantler's Hill and then first right onto Waterman's Lane. After 0.8 miles turn right onto Pixot Hill and follow signs to Brenchley which is reached after about another 0.6 miles. The walk is 6.5 miles in length and is along orchard tracks, field margins and paved footpaths which will hopefully make the walking not too muddy. The Bull Inn in the village and the Halfway House just outside will provide refreshment at the end for those that would like to take advantage.

#### Villager Excursions

The Villager runs regular excursions to a range of regional destinations, both within and outside Medway. These trips give rural residents the chance to visit places which are not currently served by a direct or affordable public transport route. The services are also known for the positive community spirit which develops from a group of residents going out for the day together.



#### Where do the Excursions Go?

The excursions visit a wide range of destinations and The Villager is always open to suggestions for new places to visit. Past trips have included

- · Rye;

- famous stately homes and gardens; and

#### Who can travel?

Anyone living in rural Medway can travel on the excursions. Before you can travel, you must become a member of a scheme by completing a membership application form (pdf 45KB).

To use this file, you will need Adobe Acrobat Reader. If you do not have this on your computer, please use our advice page. Alternatively, please use the contact information below to ask for a copy. When returning the form, please send it to the address at the foot of this page.

#### How much does it cost?

Individual membership of The Villager costs £5 or £15 for families (up to two adults and four children). Excursion prices vary but are usually between £7 and £15 per passenger.

#### How does it work?

Excursions run using a system of zones:

- · Zone A: Cliffe, Cliffe Woods, Cooling, Wainscott
- Zone B: Cuxton, Halling, Upper Halling
- Zone C: Middle/Upper Stoke, Kingsnorth, Hoo, Hoo Marina, Chattenden, Upnor
- Zone D: Grain, Lower Stoke, Allhallows, St Mary Hoo, High Halstow

Each of Medway's villages is included in one of these zones and each zone receives a service at least once each month.

To book a seat, simply give call the number below and say which service you would like to travel on. As a member, you can specify which bus stop you would like to be picked up from and members with mobility difficulties can be picked up from home.

The Villager will contact a day or two before the date of the excursion to confirm that the service is running and give you a pick up time. As the routes are flexible and dependent on which passengers have booked a seat, it is not possible to publicise a fixed timetable but the pick-up will be within a 15-minute time slot.






