Diabetes Charity Event 21st September 2013

An outline programme has been agreed for the Charity Event in support of the Junior Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF) on 21st September to be held on the Cricket Ground and the Recreation Ground.

A 6-a-side cricket competition will start on the cricket ground at 10am, with the final starting at 5pm. There will be a break from cricket during the afternoon for games for young children. A variety of stalls, displays and other activities will take place during the course of the day, on both grounds, prior to evening entertainment. A centrepiece of the fund-raising will be a Grand Draw, for which tickets are expected to be on sale at various outlets from June onwards. Prizes include £500, an iPad and a Fortnum and Mason hamper. An auction of sporting items including a signed cricket bat (New Zealand and Australian Test teams) and a round of golf for four at a prestigious Berkshire course will be held during the early evening.

All village organisations are welcome, and indeed encouraged, to participate by setting up stalls and running other activities for their own fund-raising purposes. Many have already expressed a wish to take part, and a meeting is being held on 7th June in the Cricket Pavilion to develop programme details, to which all groups are welcome. The meeting will start at 7.30pm.

High Halstow Hikers

In May, 15 of us did a 3-hour walk around the village of Brenchley just to the east of Tunbridge Wells. The village is best known for its blacksmith, Watt Tyler, who led the Peasants' revolt in the 14th Century. Although initially successful in opposing the poll tax(!) he went a bit to far in his demands and as a result was killed at Smithfields. The village still has a working forge close to where we parked. The Kent Iron Industry was also centred around here and reminders of that time continue in place names like Furnace Pond which as we found to be much more attractive than it sounds. We had excellent weather for the walk which was "complicated" by some directions which depended largely on the presence of a golf course which unfortunately had gone out of business and was now unrecognizable. Hence we saw rather more of the glorious blossom in a large orchard than we had planned. Some placed some blame on Ron's map reading but I think that was unfair: on a map it is easy to mixup a castle surrounded by a large moat for a modest farm reservoir. Anyway we fortunately have a very tolerant group of walkers who were determined to complete the walk (or at least 90% of it) despite the diversion. Excellent beer at the Bull Inn rounded things off nicely.

The June walk is on Sunday 9th and as usual will begin at 10.00. The route is a change from that planned which was to have been around Stoke Marshes, but that one will be led by Alan Marshall in July. Instead the June walk will start from the car park at Holly Hill. This is reached by turning right at the top of Birling Hill to the west of Snodland. KCC gives a postcode of DA13 0UB. The walk will go to Luddesdown along the Wealdway passing the tiny and remote Dode Church. As usual we will walk for between 2 and 3 hours. On 20th June we expect about 35 schools and a total of 300 young people to take part in what is always a good if exhausting day. There will be 8 pitches on Rayners Meadow and a further 8 on the Recreation Ground.

Finally, the Club is pleased to be helping with the Diabetes Charity Event and will be participating fully in raising funds for both the Club and JDRF. We are looking forward to a very busy and productive day.




