

## Mast Update

The Parish Council Planning committee met with Medway Council Planning and Developers today to discuss siting for the proposed mast. The developers are keen to work with the community to successfully bring a 4G mobile phone signal into the village.

They pointed out that we would almost certainly be getting another application to site a similar mast from the developers who have the contract to provide Emergency Services 4G cover for the whole country especially in rural areas. They also pointed out that it is possible for providers to share masts but this does require some negotiation between those providers.

We have suggested three possible alternatives:

- 1) Adjacent to the Village Hall.
- 2) Christmas Lane, just beyond the 30mph signs.
- Highway land in the general area of the Vets and roundabout at the bottom of Christmas Lane.

The developers have agreed to look at each site in turn to assess its feasibility. They seemed most enthusiastic about "Highway land in the general area of the Vets at the bottom of Christmas Lane" but did add that for any alternative to be acceptable, it would need to be feasible. We will not know if any of the alternatives are feasible until the middle of June.

It is likely that the current planning application MC/16/1896, if not withdrawn to accommodate an alternative site, will go to the planning committee at the end of June 2016. It is therefore imperative we as individuals and as a community continue to make representation, either for or against, to the planning department by commenting via the council web site at:

# Resume of The Parish Council Meeting Held On 11 May 2016

The meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> May was the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, where the Chairman is elected for the year and membership of committees and representation on other bodies is decided. George Crozer was re-elected Chairman. Cllr Williams was on holiday. The meeting was attended by Cllr Roy Freshwater of Medway Council and by 15 residents.

Stuart Bailey has resigned due to family and work commitments. I would like to thank him on behalf of everybody for his work for the Parish Council over the last few years, especially during the last year as Vice-chairman, for his expertise on planning matters and for his representation of the Parish Council on the Medway Area Committee of the Kent Association of Local Councils. Stuart's resignation has left us with a casual vacancy. If you're interested in joining the Parish Council, please see the notice elsewhere in High Halstow Times and on the noticeboards.

There were no nominations for the office of Vice-chairman. As not all members were present, the item was deferred to the next meeting.

The biggest issue was a planning application for a mobile phone mast right in the centre of the village, on the grass between Eden Road and The Street. Naturally the residents of Eden Road who would be directly affected by the mast being sited in front of their houses were not at all happy with the proposal. However, everyone agreed that a mast was needed somewhere in the village as mobile phone signals are poor, but that this was in totally the wrong place. A mast here could scarcely be more prominent. George is in talks with the planning case officer and the applicant to see if an alternative less sensitive site can be found.

Fencing was high on the agenda. The fence round the cricket pitch is repeatedly being vandalised and this time it will cost nearly £750 to repair. This, don't forget, comes out of *your* purse through the parish precept raised through the council tax. That's about £1 per household. The other fence is one that has been erected by a householder adjacent to the Recreation Ground, near the all-weather path. She says it is on her boundary as shown on her title deeds and that the previous fence had been erected within her boundary. This is being investigated as to the correct boundary between this property and the Recreation Ground.

The old climbing frame in the playpark is the only item of play equipment that was not replaced a few years ago. It was decided in principle that this will now be replaced. Cllr Chris Watson is doing the research and seeking grants towards the cost. If you can help with this, please contact Chris. Every penny is helpful and even a small donation will go towards making this possible. Also in the playpark, new swing seats will shortly be installed and minor repairs will be made to the safety surfaces. The vandalised litter bin has also been replaced. This is another cost to residents generally.

A complaint was made about the inconsiderate parking at school times now that the pedestrian crossing has been put in. The pedestrian crossing was achieved by a combination of pressure from parents and the Parish Council for the safety of all. That the regulations attached are being abused is a sad reflection on some people. Please be aware the parking enforcement unit has visited and at least one ticket has been issued.

Finally, preparations for the event to be held in June to celebrate the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday are well in hand. Enjoy!

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> June in the Memorial Hall at 8 pm. You are all welcome to attend.

#### High Halstow Village Hall Finance Report 2015/16

#### Profit And Loss Account – General Account

Increased booking has seen the income for the General Account rise by £2,600. Income from general bookings, not including the Doctors Rent for the Surgery, is up 16%. In 2015/16 hall fees were not increased so all of this increase is down to increased usage, which shows the improvements that have been carried out have brought in new streams of income.

With regard to expenditure, the main reporting item is that electricity costs are lower this year due to overestimating the charge that needed to be accrued at the end of last year.

As a result of this the Hall Committee were able to transfer a further £2,000 in addition to the Doctors Rent to the HUGH Fund whilst leaving a reasonable working balance for the main hall. Historically we have had a working balance of up to £3,000 and this year we will have just under £4,500. I suspect that this is the healthiest balance the Hall has ever had.

#### **HUGH Fund**

The HUGH Fund obtains its funds from the following sources:

- Fund Raising
- · Contributions from the General Account
- · Donations

We have a number of regular fund raising activities under the banner of the HUGH Fund including the following:

- · Quizathons; which are always popular
- · Golf Tournament; which continues to grow
- · Sale of High Halstow calendars
- · Various Bars

This source of income increased by 42% last year and the monies raised was used on Phase Three.

As previously reported all the income from the Doctors Surgery is transferred to the HUGH Fund in order to service the outstanding loan from Phase One. As mentioned earlier a further £2,000 was able to be transferred in 2015/16 due to increased lettings. Again this money was spent on Phase Three.

We have been extremely lucky this year that we have received over £31,000 in donations. Not only did this allow the kitchen works to be finished in Phase Three, this has allowed Phase Four works to be commissioned in full and this will be undertaken in the coming year. Thank you all so much for these donations, I promise you it is appreciated and I hope this means that we are doing something right. In terms of unspent monies from the HUGH Fund as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, we have £30,292.

## Friends of St Margaret's Finance Report 2015/16

I am going to try and not repeat myself too much from the Chairman's Report but feel I need to comment on the financial statements circulated as follows:



#### **Subscriptions**

We started the year with twenty two monthly subscriptions and although we lost one we gained another two leaving the monthly subscriptions at twenty three. We are currently receiving £160 per month from these monthly subscriptions. In addition we have a further three people who paid annually. We have submitted all the paperwork regarding Gift Aid and this will be reflected in next years accounts.

#### Fund Raising Events

The Friends raised money from the Christmas Tree Festival and Cake Festival. The Tree Festival is more about raising awareness and is well received within the community as attendance shows, The Cake Festival I believe can still grow and become a regular feature with the Village calendar.

In addition we have been fortunate that Ray Collins has gone out of his way to sell Christmas cards destined for this purpose. The annual visit from Santa Claus also produced nearly £1000 to the accounts.

#### <u>Balances</u>

The amount at the end of the year amounts to £8,223 with half of this being earmarked for the roof replacement when due. The other monies are available for the PCC to approach us for funding.

#### **Investment of Funds**

At last years meeting it was agreed to approach Medway Council in order to invest the funds with them at 0.5% above base rate but unfortunately they were not able to offer this and the committee decided not to invest and this is to be brought back to this years AGM for consideration for the coming year.

#### Way Forward for 2016/17

An idea only given to me last week was to seek permission from the PCC so that we can advertise on a wall the ability to make a contribution to the Friends by showing the bank details as there maybe people willing to make a one of donation rather than being regular subscribers. From this meeting I will look to have this carried out as soon as possible.

I have already mentioned the various festivals, Tree and Cake. There will be a third one this year with the March of the Scarecrows which will feature as part of the Queens Birthday Celebrations. We hope you can join in .

I have also been approached by Maggie Ryan on behalf of the Cuxton Music Group who wish to put on a performance on July 13<sup>th</sup>. I would like to express my thanks for this kind offer and the full details of this are in the High Halstow Times.

Although to be honest this group is slowly building funds, I have always believed that we would be able to attract other people supporting us once we have projects identified by the PCC. To that aim I will be advertising the fact the next project the PCC will be requesting support will be in relation to the state of the electrics.

## High Halstow Hikers

In early May, fifteen of the Hikers made a journey to northwest Norfolk to do 2 walks over what was fortunately a very sunny weekend– the warmest of the year so far. It was particularly good to reacquaint with the Fletchers who had driven up from Devon. Our first walk was through the RSPB reserve at Snettisham, a village close to Sandringham. This takes you through a set of lakes to the beach on the eastern side of the Wash. We timed the walk to be in the late afternoon as recommended by RSPB to coincide with a spring-tide and experience the so-called "wader spectacular". As the water races in across the vast mudflats the incoming tide forces 10,000's of waders feeding out on the mud to take to the air and perform very impressive flight formations, on this occasion glinting in the early evening sun. As the mud became increasingly flooded large groups sped at low level over our heads to the gravel pits behind. The walk back to the cars worked up a thirst and appetite that was satisfied by drinks and excellent food at the Rose-and-Crown in Snettisham, the 2015 UK pub of the year.

The next morning we ventured a little further north, just beyond Hunstanton, to start our walk from Holmenext-the-Sea, a very attractive small village that is set nicely between the main coast road and the sea. We followed a route named "Blood-and-Sand" by a local walking group although we never quite worked out the "blood" part. The walk took us through a small nature reserve to the dunes that edge much of that coast to reach the beach that stretched into the distance because of the low tide. The walk to the west eventually took us through gathering groups of sunbathers to the strange multi-coloured cliffs at Hunstanton and shortly afterwards to welcome refreshment on the lawn of the Ancient Mariners looking out over the sea. The route back to Holme took us along the edge of the golf course on the left and past a beautifully clear, flowing stream on the right on which we passed many families of ducklings hurrying across the top of the water to the safety of mum and dad. At the end of the varied walk of about 5.5 miles there was unanimous agreement that the trip to Norfolk had been very worthwhile.

Our June walk will be on Sunday 12th June (NOT Saturday 11th so that we can avoid HH's celebration of Queen's 90thbirthday). The plan is to have a BBQ on the shingle beach of St Mary's Bay; this is best done close to high-tide which means an afternoon walk starting at 3.00 from St Mary's Hoo. Please park close to the farm (ME3 8RW) which is the first building in the village when you turn left up Hall Road from the Ratcliffe Highway on the way to Allhallows. Bring whatever you wish to cook. The walk will be about 5miles in total. Because of holidays the next two walks will be later in the months at 10.00 on Sunday's 17thJuly and 21st August. The first of these will be around Westerham close to Chartwell (Churchill's country house). All are welcome on the walks.
