Queens 90th Birthday Celebrations Saturday 11th June 2016

The morning started at around 9am with the early arrival of the scarecrows, the stall holders being allowed onto the field and the photographer from the Kent Messenger arriving to take his pictures. The Village Hall was decorated with bunting, pictures of Her Majesty and signs telling us when and where things were. The

sound system installed and tested, the beer, wine and soft drinks all lined-up facing front. The burger van started frying bacon butties and the ice cream van arrived to take it's place. The stall holders perfected their displays, straightened their signs, counted their float and stood ready in anticipation.

High Halstow was ready to party!



2pm soon arrived and a small trickle of people turned into a large crowd. Garden chairs, picnic blankets and gazebo's were laid out in the centre of the recreation ground.
Villagers had arrived to make a day of it. The stall holders were busy selling their wares,

coaxing customers to 'have a go', pouring drinks and cutting cake. Donkeys carried children backwards

and forwards across the field. Crazy bikes and duelling with pugil sticks kept the more energetic entertained. Her Majesty posed for pictures whilst the music played out and everyone was having a great time. In the main hall Karmann Dancers and Glowfitt entertained a large crowd of onlookers whilst sipping a cup of tea freshly poured from the newly refurbished kitchen. Everyone was having a good time and enjoying all the effort that the organising committee had gone to. Unfortunately, however, the one thing that could not be controlled was the weather, and at about 4:30pm the heavens opened. Never has a field of people cleared so quickly! Stall holders packed their things away as fast as they could and the Village Hall was mobbed with revellers taking cover, whilst some of the hardy tried to sit it out under their gazebos. The Peninsula Fryer did it's best to carry on supplying hot fresh fish and chips. Eventually the rain started to subside and the clear up operation outside could start. The live evening entertainment, Jonny Kaplan and the UK Lazy Stars struck up





again, although with a noticeable absence of men who had returned home to 'suffer' the pleasure of watching England v Russia in the Euro's.

Organising Committee (who I know are too modest to let me name them all here, but you know who you are), all the stall holders and helpers; and especially thanks to everyone who

made a scarecrow, it certainly brightened up High Halstow, and we may see them return next year, watch this space.

Mast Update

The developers carefully considered and rejected our alternative sites, due to various different reasons/concerns and continued with their original application. This application went to Medway Council Planning Committee last night (29/6/16). It was discussed and our objections were taken into consideration.

However, unfortunately, the application was approved. An amendment to the original application is that the mast has been lowered from 15m to 12.5 m.

Medway Council Planning has advised that the developers will probably still consider alternative sites on private ground and would be prepared to act as intermediary for us.

I'm proposing to have an open session at the next HH Parish Council meeting on Wednesday 13th July at 8pm in the Memorial Hall to discuss any next move.

High Halstow Hikers

Our June walk took a dozen of us from St Mary's Hoo to a lovely strip of beach made of finely broken sea shells below the Thames seawall just to the east of St Mary's Bay. The walk of about 2.5 miles each way gives views across the North Kent marshes and along the Thames from Tilbury to Southend and beyond as soon as one enters the fields beyond St Mary's village. In my opinion these are the most impressive views for many miles around. We were very fortunate to walk in the afternoon rather than the morning, as is our norm, since this provided us with a few hours of warm sunshine rather than the downpours that blighted most of the weekend. We chose the afternoon since it coincided with a high-tide that hid the massive expanse of mud that is enjoyed by the waders but less by those like us keen on cooking food on the beach. We had a wide variety of materials on which to barbeque but next time we will try to remember a frying pan to put on the flotsam-fed fire. We arrived back at St Mary's about 3 hours later having not seen another soul.

Our July walk will be around Westerham and take in the edge of the Chartwell estate that formed Churchill's private residence for many years. The walk will be about 5 miles in length and will start at 10.00 on Sunday 17th from the Green in the middle of the village where Churchill's Statue stands. The Green is on the northern edge of the A25 close to St Mary the Virgin Church (TN16 1AS). Parking is on the road.

Mealtimes can be a busy time for families and often residents find themselves trying to juggle many other tasks while trying to cook for everyone. Whether its trying to get the kids organised or catching up with household chores, it is tempting to try to fit in other pressing jobs while waiting for food to cook. There are many of other distractions that can cause you to take your eye off of your cooking: maybe the phone ringing or a text message or even a knock at the door. Or maybe taking a few moments to catch the end of a favourite TV programme or to check your social media newsfeed or helping with homework... whatever the activity, you can be sure that it is preventing you from concentrating fully on your cooking. In a hectic home it's easy to get diverted for longer than you intended, and even forget all about your cooking. For most of the time, the worst that may happen is that you burn the dinner, causing a bit of an inconvenience. But sadly, as Kent Fire and Rescue Service (KFRS) knows only too well, unattended cooking can lead to a serious fire, that could result in severe damage to your home and may put you, and your family, at risk.

Unfortunately, over half of all the fires KFRS attends start in the kitchen and the majority are caused by unattended cooking, a build up of grease and fat on the cooker, or by kitchen mishaps, where items such as tea towels, chopping boards or washing baskets have been placed on a hot hob. By taking a few moments to work out what is coming between you and a fire safe mealtime, you can avoid a fire of this type happening in your home.

Make fire safety your main ingredient and help prevent a kitchen fire in your home by following these tips: * Keep an eye on your cooking and remember to switch off your cooker if you have to leave the room

- * Use a timer for items placed in your oven or grill to remind when your food is done and to save it from burning
- * Plan and prepare if you know you have a busy week ahead, try and plan in advance and prepare meals that do not require lots of cooking
- * Avoid storing or placing household items on your cooker or stove
- * Keep your cooker, grill and oven clean to avoid a build up of grease and fat that could start a fire * Keep children and pets well away from you cooking area
- * Ensure electric cookers, toasters and microwaves are turned off at the mains when you have finished using them
- * Fit a working smoke alarm on each floor of your home and test it weekly to ensure it provides early warning in the event of a fire.

5pm and there may be an opportunity for a meet and greet after 3.30pm.


