RESUME OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 14 JUNE 2017

The meeting held on 14TH June was held in the Blue Room of the Recreation Hall, to take advantage of the wi-fi. Linda Atkinson has been working on a provisional website which is free and has been specifically designed for parish councils and she gave a demonstration of the work in progress so far. A feature particularly liked was the planning, which takes information about planning applications from Medway Council's website seamlessly. It was pointed out that as a local authority the Parish Council should have a .gov.uk domain name and this was agreed. At the time of writing highhalstow-pc.gov.uk has been registered and we are waiting for it to be approved. Once approved, the new website will go live. It will run in parallel with the existing highhalstow.org.uk website.

It was reported that so far there have been 2 applications to fill the casual vacancy. The successful candidate will be co-opted at the meeting to be held on 12th July.

There were no objections to the three planning applications.

There was discussion about setting up Drop Box. The consensus was that this would be a good idea, but as this might have implications for the Clerk who uses her own PC, it was deferred to the Personnel Committee.

A plan of a car park layout was tabled, followed by a site visit. A few alterations were made to the plan. The car park is due to be laid out on 5th July. The school has been alerted. This will also establish "IN" and "OUT" for the entrances.

There have been complaints about overgrown hedges, making it difficult to walk past on the pavements. Would residents who have hedges in their front gardens please take care they are not overhanging and making it difficult for other residents? We have asked our contractors to trim back the hedge by the entrance to the Recreation Ground on Christmas Lane.

So far we haven't found a new editor for High Halstow Times. Linda Atkinson has volunteered to take it over until someone is found.

Chris Peek said that the Youth Club still needs adult helpers. If you can volunteer, please contact her.

Chris Watson reported that 23 poems were submitted by children and 3 selected for the plaque to go with the commemorative trees to be planted in the autumn. Prizes will be presented at a school assembly.

Lesley Munday has been replaced by Ray Collins as one of the parish council nominees on the Friends of St Margaret's (the other is George Crozer). The Friends are planning more activities.

Chris Peek reported that last year's accounts of Relief in Need are now on the Charity Commission's website.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 12th July in the Memorial Hall at 8 pm. We look forward to seeing you there.

SCARE CROWS?

High Halstow and the invasion of Scarecrows! But where did they come from?

Scarecrows can be first dated back to ancient Egypt, where they were made to prevent flocks of quail from destroying the wheat fields along the Nile River. Wooden frames with nets were set up and the Egyptians would hide in the nearby fields and scare the birds into the nets, whereby they would be captured and taken home for dinner!

Countries around the world, including Greece, Rome, and Japan continued to progress with their

own tactics by using animal skulls, rotten foods & meats, ugly wooden carved statues and

eventually figures shaped and dressed like humans - (glad the people of High Halstow have stayed

clear of a few of these!)

'Bird scarers' or 'bird shooers' were more commonly used in Medieval Britain however. Young

boys aged 9 and upwards would be sent to walk the fields, throwing stones and waving their arms

about to scare the birds away. But, after the Great Plague in 1348, bird scarers were hard to come by and farmers turned to stuffing sacks with straw, carving faces into them and leaving them against wooden poles. The small amount of children that were still around had to patrol up to 3 acres of land by themselves and so reverted to using wooden clappers and sound to do the job.

The scarecrow is still one of the preferred scaring tactics used to this day, even though there are a vast amount of others on the market. They can be found in many a field (and garden) around the area, and are only becoming more advanced and scary as time goes by. Question is, will your homemade scarecrow make the cut???

High Halstow Hikers

In early June a baker's dozen of us took a walk from Sissinghurst village towards and around Sissinghurst castle that is owned by the National Trust and renowned for its gardens.

Although the walk started in cloud the morning brightened greatly to give perfect early summer walking conditions. The walk passed through the very attractive castle estate that includes some lovely meandering woodland paths and several lakes as well as giving frequent views across the Weald. In one of the lakes well over 100 fish, which we thought were probably rudd, rested peacefully in the clear water close to a short jetty, presumably being attracted there by the likely experience of food (but not from us!).

Most of our route was around what is described by the Trust as the long walk while the route to join this from Sissinghurst was drawn from the ever-useful Ordnance Survey book of Kent walks. While the route gave several clear views of the castle and parts of its lovely gardens and surrounding moat it does not give access to the castle grounds themselves. But free access is available to the very well-preserved and in some cases strikingly beautiful outbuildings. We took advantage of the excellent ice-cream available there and ate this sitting alongside a lovely small field of tall wild white daisies. After a walk of a little over 5 miles several of us also indulged in refreshments in the garden of the Milk House.

Our next walk will be a break from our routine of Sunday sand will be on Saturday 8th July starting from the driveway to Brickhouse Farm (ME3 8RP) at 10.45. This is reached by taking the Allhallows turn from the Fenn Street roundabout on the A228 road towards Grain and after about 3 miles turning right into Cuckolds Green Road as the road takes a sharp bend to the left. The driveway is then immediately on the left. The goal is to walk to the sea wall about 2.5 miles away where the tide will be in to allow us to have a barbecue on one of the shingle beaches. If you wish to cook please bring your own food. You may wish to bring a disposable barbecue but we also expect to make some small fires to cook on from the flotsam on the beach. Please also make sure that you have something to carry away any rubbish. This will be the third time we have done a walk/barbecue of this type and the previous were very enjoyable indeed.



An empowering story, which leaves you thinking just how much times and cultures have changed,


and still hold place for change, and how powerful love really is, regardless of whether it is between


friends or lovers.

Considerate Parking



is a nice place to live where children, older residents and walkers should feel safe. Some may not be as aware of the traffic as they might otherwise be. Please be careful.




