#### High Halstow Cricket Club – August 2012

As I write, there are 2 league games to be played by all three senior sides. Whilst relegation for both the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> XIs is not a mathematical certainty, by the close of play on 25<sup>th</sup> August, both sides are likely to be returning to Division 4 for the 2013 season. Clearly this is very disappointing for all concerned with the club, but the loss of so many experienced players from last year has left the selectors struggling to put out viable teams. When there is a shortage of numbers, it is the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI that suffers. As a consequence, several of their games have been conceded – although they have also benefited from concessions by other teams. It seems we are not alone to have problems this year. The 3rds look as though they will finish 7<sup>th</sup> in the Kent Regional League Division 1B (Central) – in the circumstances not a bad effort.

With 2 games to play, the Sunday League XI are looking for a mid-table finish in Division 3 of the Aero Development League. This league is a valuable education for the younger players, as the playing conditions require each team to field a minimum of 6 players under 21 years.

The Sunday Friendly XI has won 3, lost 3 and had 4 rained off. It is a pity that many of our "social" players missed such a large percentage of their season through the vagaries of the English weather.

The Colts have had a mixed season. Unfortunately we were unable to field an U11 Softball team this year, but the U11 hardball team held its own in the Medway Colts League, despite losing several of last year's team through old age! These young players (mostly under 12s) played U13 cricket this season and did very well to finish 2<sup>nd</sup> in the league. Their highlight, however, was victory in the U13 Cup followed by winning the League Championship pay-off – well done. The U15s struggled in their league, but they learned a lot and will do better next year. The U17s, drawn at times from all the colts age groups, finished a very creditable mid-table. In the Medway Colts Cricket Festival, the U16 team (again drawn from all the age groups) had an enjoyable couple of weeks, winning half their games.

So far as the weather is concerned, this has been the worst season any of us can remember,. We could have played throughout March and early April, but thereafter was nothing short of disastrous for us, and for other teams around the county. In all, we have lost 33 out of 115 matches to the weather. Many of these games could have been played but for the puddles on parts of the outfield, which lingered longer that one would have thought possible. We need to do all possible to improve the drainage during the course of this winter. It is a sad fact of life that the loss of complete matches means a loss of revenue to the club. Meanwhile, necessary expenditure continues to accumulate. No one is happy!

If there is good news to be read, it is that no player has left High Halstow for another club. Players have moved away, retired, or taken a step back for family reasons. However, plenty of work will be required to put 3 competitive teams out next year, if we are to make a swift return to the successes of the recent past.



#### High Halstow Hikers

A small group of us did an 8 mile circular walk from Reculver taking in part of the Wantsum Way. The weather was warm and sunny and the high tide made the beach an attractive proposition. But we ignored this temptation and headed inland to the marshland and small fields that persist in the area. Many of these were being harvested as we walked around them. One feature that unfortunately does not persist is the promised (by Ordnance Survey map book) remote and famous pub about 3/4 of the way round. This is now instead an unremarkable house with a large dark patch on the wall where the pub sign used to hang. Fortunately there is an attractive watering hole back in Reculver.

The September walk will be led by Alan Marshall and will be more local starting from Lower Higham where the Chequers and Railway Inn are. It should be ok to park up around there. The walk will follow the route of the old canal for about a mile and a half to Hoo Junction, then take the old military road down to Shornmead Fort. The sea wall will be followed past Higham Saltings, turning back towards Higham along the edge of the old gravel pits, crossing the railway at Church Street and heading across the fields back into Lower Higham. Medway Council in partnership with The Reading Agency, Medway Libraries will once again be running the Summer Reading Challenge.


The challenge is for 4 to 12-year-olds and available in all 16 libraries in Medway. The theme for summer 2012 will be Story Lab.

Dear HHT,

It is with some regret that I must inform the villige that the strip of land between the RSPB woods and my grazing fields is now closed to unauthorised use. Sadly since the sale and division of Buckhole Farm, it would seem that some members of High Halstow village view passage around my boundaries as a right. After four years of insults, verbal abuse and threats by a very small minority and the culmination of either the crass stupidity or unbelievable arrogance of one person who chose to walk through a live shoot, the barriers to access will remain. This person who and I quote "I have walked around here for ten years and you wont stop me"deliberately broke through the barriers put there to protect walkers. As always, shoots are organised with safety the highest priority therefore this person was spotted and advised of his actions.

It would also seem that a person has taken to cutting down my trees and shrubbery, and cut through the fencing between the RSPB site and my land to make their own personal walkway, I would remind this person that this is in fact criminal damage and the issue is being addressed. The land between my stock line and actual boundary is not RSPB land, it is not a public footpath. it is private land, the public footpaths are well documented. If any resident of High Halstow seeks clarification please enquire at either the parish council or for a small fee the land registery should be able to assist. Again with the most sincere apologies to the decent residents of High Halstow who now have to use the documented footpaths safety has to be the highest consideration. Buckhole Farm will never be a working farm again, the land is not a local amenity, its now fenced plots are owned by several individuals. I would ask residents to respect that the land had been available to purchase at open auction and is now privately owned. whilst it had been very pleasant to chat to some walkers, others have offered a barrage of abuse. i would also remind users of the documented footpaths to please keep their dogs on a lead and children under control as advised in the countryside code. we are a smallholding and have a variety of stock. Please close the access gates behind you, there has been in recent days instances where mares and foals have become separated, much to the distress of both and injury to a foal, there has also been instances of loose dogs chasing the goats. please do not allow children to approach the stock as the animals find it distressing particularly the nannies with kids. A solution to closing the gate would be of course to change from a gate to a style. again it is with disappointment that I feel this action to deny access around the land of Woodview farm has become necessary.
