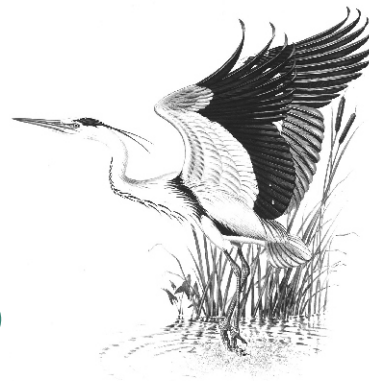

Whilst going to press the Village Hall Committee are trying to finalise the commencement of works for the refurbishment of the Village Hall. This would be for Phase One of the works which includes a new roof, an additional room on the first floor, replacement of the back wall and new fire doors.

Prices have been received and these are being evaluated with the Parish Council who are part funding these works. It is planned, assuming all in order, for the works to commence in September with the Hall being out of action for hirers for up to 12 weeks. Please note though the Doctors Surgery will remain open as this part of the Hall is not being touched during this phase, however the current waiting room will be closed. This facility will be replaced in the short term with the room next to the stage and/or the corridor. This will be discussed with the Doctors shortly

Work is still being undertaken by the Committee in seeking additional funds and several grant applications have since been completed which hopefully will enable the remainder of the work to be carried out sooner rather than later

Please note the car park will be reduced in capacity whilst the work is undertaken. This will enable deliveries of materials and removal as required. The contractor will be instructed to have its lorries coming and going outside of the school run. I appreciate that this may provide a short term problem but health and safety has to play a part. Please watch for notices in the Village hall for further details.

High Halstow Cricket Club - August 2011

With the colts season being completed so successfully last month, it has been the turn of the adults to resolve the outstanding issues of promotion and relegation. With the last Kent League fixtures to be played on 3rd September, the 1st lie 6th in the league and need just 4 points to be mathematically clear of relegation. Their clash with promoted Linden Park, who themselves need just 4 points for the Division 3 title, will be tense, but with 8 bonus points available to each side plus winning bonuses, we remain confident. At least 2 of the teams below us have to get maximum points from their games to prevent us from staying up. Results in August have been much better with 2 wins, 1 defeat and 1 game abandoned. Since we snatched defeat from the jaws of victory in the 12 run defeat at Sidcup at the end of last month we have seen a greater consistency of performance. Adam Colgate and Jake Barrett have shown maturity beyond their years, whilst Ashley Trigg has rediscovered some of his form from last year

The 2nd XI secured their place for a fourth season in Division 3 (2nd XI's) next year with a run of successful run chases in August. These were led by skipper Darren Brumbaugh, who has not been dismissed in any innings since July 23rd. During that time, he has amassed 412 runs in 5 knocks, and is a firm favourite to win the division's batting award for the second year running.

The 3rd XI will return to Division 1B (Central) of the Kent Feeder League after a very disappointing season. We have a lot of work to do this winter to ensure that the club can put out sufficiently strong teams every week to justify all the effort put in to developing the ground at Hoo School.

The Sunday League XI has had a good inaugural season in the Kent Sunday Development League, although could so easily have capped it with promotion to Division 2. Losses by just one wicket and 4 runs in the final 2 games left the team in 4th place.

The final games of the Club's season will be played over the weekend of 17th and 18th September after which there will be time to compile a more comprehensive account of the summer. The Colts Presentation will be held on the ground after the match on the 17th. We look forward to seeing all players, parents and supporters that evening to help celebrate the great success achieved by all our colts in 2011. It will be a fun event. **David Laphorn, Chairman**

All Saints Church Allhallows Open Afternoon

Allhallows has a church called All Saints Church. The name of the village Allhallows and the name All Saints are entwined as the word Hallows means Saints. Have **YOU** visited the church?

On September 10th between 14.00 and 16.00, the Church will be open to visitors who may like to see what the inside of the church is like or find out more about All Saints Church Allhallows long history. Please come and join us for tea/coffee and cake and look around, it is **FREE** Maybe your family has history entwined with the Church; relatives who had baptisms, weddings or funerals there, come and look at what the church/village used to look like when your family used the church

The church at Allhallows was one of the seven Parish of Hoo St Werburgh churches mentioned in the Domesday Book of 1085. (Imagine being round that long) the parish registers start in 1629 and 1841 when Allhallows parish had a population of 268 people. Since Saxon times the church has altered to suit the parish needs or fashions of the times. A living church should be suited to the people it serves - as history has shown. An example of this is in the font which was originally put in the church about 1220 when it was painted red and yellow, something perhaps strange/unfamiliar to us now. The pulpit dates from George III a fashion of the times

Change is in the air again due to the huge cost of upkeep of this grande historic building, the only one in Allhallows. Come and see living history while you still can

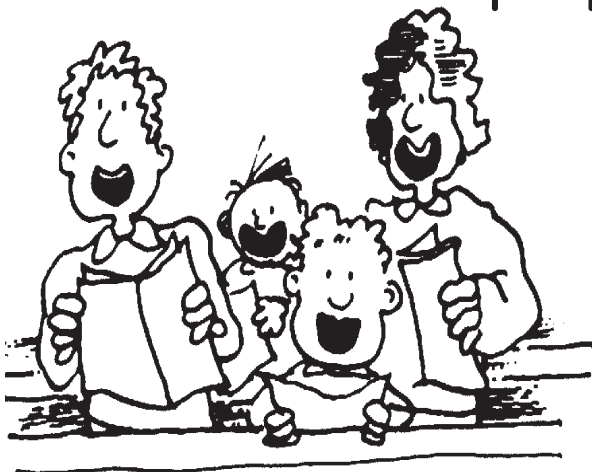

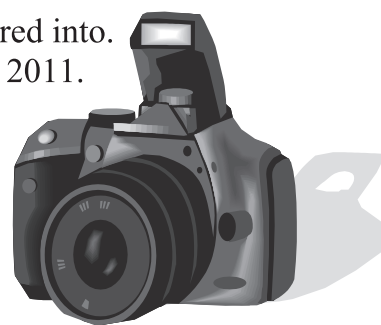
The Judges decision will be final and no correspondence can be entered into.

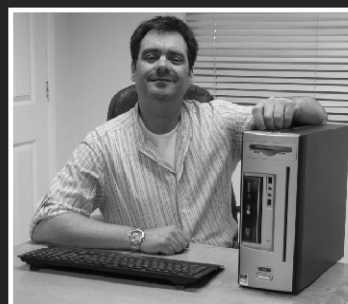
