To Tie or Not to Tie Daffodils?

That was the question posed by Laurie Manser who came to talk to us at our September meeting. Laurie gave an insight into the intricacies of growing and showing daffodils to national standard. He described the process of dividing and developing bulbs with a new variety taking 5 years to introduce. He estimates that at present there are staggering 45,000 different types of daffodil/narcissus. He recommended that is was best for the bulb not to tie up the leaves once the daffodil has finished flowering. We are pleased that we have some volunteers willing to stand for election at our AGM in February to organise the outings next year. For people who don't receive benefits but have hard to treat cavity walls, there is an offer of up to £1000 off the cost of the work to insulate them. If you have previously been declined for cavity wall insulation or think you have hard to treat cavities there may now be a solution to them.

All the offers are open to people who own their own homes or live in private rented housing.

The whole process is simple, all you have to do is give British Gas a call and if you are eligible, they will book in a survey at a time convenient to you. Their survey is completely free and is just to make sure that your home can benefit from any additional measures. They will then arrange a time to undertake the work.

OF TRAFFIC ORDER 2013)

NOTICE OF INTENTION

Notice is hereby given that Medway Council intend to make an order the effect of which will be to impose the following temporary prohibitions or restrictions on traffic to enable the repair and replacement of manhole frames, excavation of ditches and installation of kerbs.

Britannia Road, High Halstow - to be closed to all vehicular traffic from junction with Clinch Street to junction with Valentine Drive. Pedestrian traffic will not be affected. Access to properties will be maintained at all times via Britannia Road, A228 Sharnal Street, A228 Ratcliffe Highway, Christmas Lane and The Street.

This order will come into force on 30 September 2013 and will be valid for a maximum period of 18 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the sooner. The works are scheduled to be carried out on Monday 30 September 2013 and are programmed for completion within two weeks. The order will be effective only when the appropriate signs are being displayed.

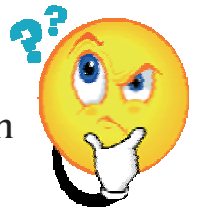
Dear HHT,
