Resume Of The Parish Council Meeting Held On 14 September 2016

The Parish Council met after the August break on 14th September. George Crozer was at work and the meeting was chaired for the first time by Chris Watson as the new Vice-chairman. Brian Williams also missed the meeting as he was on holiday. There were only two planning applications for consideration and comment to Medway Council. In both cases the Parish Council had no objection in principle, but noted that parts of the proposals appeared to be in front of the building line. Medway's planners will have a view on this. As George wasn't at the meeting, there was no update on the telecommunications mast and whether an alternative, more sympathetic siting has been

On the Recreation Ground you may have noticed

that the basket swing for older children is in need of repair. We need to go back to the company that Medway Council used when installing the "new" equipment several years ago to obtain the cost of a replacement. Meantime, we will remove the worn out basket and chains for safety reasons. The annual safety inspection on the play equipment was carried out in July and the report has now been received. It was forwarded to Brian Williams, who will comment on it at the next meeting. We have had a request for the provision of a parking bay for the disabled in the car park. After discussion it was agreed to investigate marking out the entire car park and this is being taken forward. The path from Ruggles Close to The Street across the Recreation Ground is a public right of way and will be surfaced with tarmac by Medway Council during half term week, beginning 24th October. Contractors will have vehicles and materials in the car park so please be careful during this time. Cllrs Martin Andrews and Bill Khatkar attended a local police meeting. There are widespread problems with off-road motor bikes. Please remember that these must not be ridden on either the Recreation Ground or on the open space between Half Moon Way, Gypsy Way, Ruggles Close and Topley Drive. Please remind members of your family too. A repeat offender has already been reported to the police.

Concerns In the village also include overgrown garden hedges and overhanging branches making it difficult for pedestrians to use the pavements and the constant issue of parking in Christmas Lane during cricket and football matches.

The WI has been in the village 60 years and is considering another village sign. The Youth Club has started back after the summer holidays. They need more helpers. If you would like to help out, the Youth Club meets on Tuesday evenings in the Recreation Hall.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 12th October in the Memorial Hall at 8 pm. You are all welcome to attend. If you are coming for a specific item on the agenda, it is important that you introduce yourself to the Chairman and Clerk before the start of the meeting.

Our September walk benefited from the terrific late summer weather we have had, such that the paths were all in good and dry condition save for one that had recently been ploughed across and not reinstated - tested some of our ankles. We started and finished in the attractive village of Addington that sits between the A20 and the M20, but is largely undisturbed by the 2 main roads. We crossed the A20 and walked across fields to enter West Malling by a route few of us had used before. Leaving the village via the large and well cared for churchyard we took to fields again and made our way to Offham which is best known for what is claimed to be an original quintain - an apparatus used for jousting practice. Our route back was through Church Farm where the fields were strikingly striped with multi-coloured rows of flawless lettuce and cabbage of all sorts of varieties. We re-crossed the A20 from an orchard that had been left to fend for itself but offered welcome refreshment for those with a sweet tooth. The footpath then passed through West Malling golf club and involved crossing its driving range, a first for the hikers. Were turned to Addington via the cricket pitch, past the church and along a road through the immaculate 39-acre grounds of the Seekers Trust a centre for prayer and healing. Most of the 15 of us then savoured the fare at the Angel Inn. The Sunday roast lunch that some took was clearly excellent and was eyed enviously by those that didn't.

Our walk on Sunday 16th October will be a more local one and will start at 10.00 from the entrance to Brickhouse Farm, thats its at the junction of the Ratcliffe Highway (the main Road to Allhallows) and Cuckholds Green Rd (ME3 8RP). 





Stoptober: Breathe easy in Medway

Medway Council is encouraging its residents to breathe easy this October and get help to quit smoking as part of Stoptober. Public Health England's national campaign runs throughout October and the 28-day challenge supports people to stop smoking for good.

The council has a team of public health professionals working with smokers throughout the year to help them stub the habit. They work in a variety of locations across Medway and offer a free stop smoking service, providing advice on the health risks of smoking as well as support to stub the habit. There are stop smoking services running all over Medway, including a Stop Smoking Shop in Chatham town centre, in GP practices, pharmacies, workplaces and within the military.

Scott Elliott, Head of Health and Wellbeing at Medway Council said: "Medway's stop smoking service is accredited by the National Centre for Smoking Cessation Treatments and the Royal Society of Public Health for the extensive work carried out locally. There are a number of free initiatives in place to support local people in their fight to kick the habit - our stop smoking team can provide one-to-one advice and support. They recognise that every smoker is different and will work closely with each smoker to agree a date to quit smoking and prepare them for their stop smoking journey to give them the best chance to quit.

"Smoking has been found to cause heart disease, cancers and strokes. It can also increase stress due to the imbalance in chemicals that nicotine causes and is also a risk factor for cancer. By quitting smoking, people will feel less stressed, have more money, breathe more easily and generally have a longer, healthier life."

As well as offering advice to individuals, the team has also been supporting workplaces. They are currently helping Medway Foundation Trust to become a smoke-free organisation and to discourage people from lighting up in Medway Maritime Hospital's grounds. The change is aimed to help promote healthier living and to reduce second hand smoke inhalation.

The team is also reaching out to younger people to advise them of the health risks of smoking and to offer support to help them curb their habit. They are supporting schools to educate young people around the harm of smoking through their personal, social, health and educational (PSHE) sessions. They are also working with schools in the area to encourage a smoke-free gates policy.

A mother-to-be gets help to stop smoking during pregnancy

Public Health and Medway Maritime Hospital jointly organised an event for health professionals to help reduce smoking prevalence and the adverse outcomes during pregnancy. On Tuesday, 27 September, a range of staff joined the star of BBC Three's Misbehaving Mums Lisa Fendall, at the hospital to discuss how the issue can be tackled. They listened to a number of speakers, including hospital Chief Executive Leslie Dwyer, Professor Ranjit Akolekar and members of Medway Council's Stop Smoking Service, who explained the risks of smoking while pregnant, from an unhealthy placenta to stillbirth and the support available to stop smoking.

A 28-year-old mother, from Gillingham, accessed the council's stop smoking team during the pregnancy of her now three-month old daughter. She said: "I had been smoking for 15 years and when I found out I was pregnant I approached the council's stop smoking team as I was concerned what effect smoking would have on my baby. I had a one-to-one meeting and we discussed all of the things that could help me quit smoking; I used an inhalator and the patches and my daughter was born in June weighing a healthy 7lbs 7ozs. I would encourage other mums-to-be to talk to the council as they were able to help me stop smoking and can help you too."

"I would encourage all smokers to be mindful that their habit could cause health implications for them, their baby and others around them. Giving up smoking isn't easy, but with help and support the chances of quitting are significantly increased."

Book a stop smoking session

There are a number of sessions being held throughout October which smokers considering quitting are invited to attend. They are being held from Monday to Saturday at The Stop Smoking Shop in Chatham town centre, and at locations in Lordswood, Rainham, Chatham, Gillingham, Strood and Rochester
