Memorial Hall 90 Years Young

The Memorial Hall has a very unique history. The majority of war memorials of whatever shape, size or design are dedicated to the men who did not return from war, but the Memorial Hall in the village was actually dedicated to the men who returned from the First World War.

The minute book records the Hall as being in use from 1920 and looking very different to how it looks today.

On 10 December 2000 the then newly formed committee decided to re-dedicate the Hall after some major refurbishment work had been carried out. At that time a lot of the relatives whose loved ones are named on the memorial board got together to reminisce and have a chat over a cup of tea. A lovely afternoon was enjoyed by all those who came along.

It is now 10 years on and we would like to get together again with the families of those named on the board. We are proposing to hold an open afternoon and dedication on Sunday 5 December between 2:00 and 4:00pm and would like to invite anyone who would be interested to come along. The Trustees and committee would like to show you the improvements that have been made since we last got together.

As an aside in 10 years time we will be celebrating 100 years of the Memorial Hall and that is probably worthy of an even bigger celebration.

If you would like any further details or you know of someone who is in some way connected to the 'board' in the hall, please give me a ring. Come along and see how the hall is looking after 90 years.

Local pony charity needs some help....

I know the subject is a little odd, but hopefully all will become clear.

Let me tell you about who we are, and then I'll get onto the help that we need.

We are Littl'uns Equine Rescue Trust (LERT), and we have recently moved onto land near High Halstow. We have been around since 2004, and in 2005 were granted charitable status (registered charity 1111359).

We only have ponies, and at present have 14 located at High Halstow, and 5 at Eynsford. Our mission has been to undertake the "Three R's" – Rescue, Rehabilitate and Rehome. Today, there are over 40 ponies across Kent that we have rehomed.

Now, today we have a problem, and that's where i'm hoping that the parishioners of High Halstow might be able to help.

We have to keep the land clear of manure, and our preferred method of control is to collect it up and remove it from the land. We moved to High Halstow from Hartley, where we had built up an excellent relationship with local gardeners and allotments. The reason being is that the manure we collect up is, if you'll pardon the pun, pure. We do not stable our ponies, so there is no hay or straw mixed in with it, which is the usual hurdle to gardeners wanting to take it, as you would have to wait for the manure to rot down and the "extra components" to decompose. From what I am told, being just grass based fibre, our ponies product is ready to mix in almost immediately.

We don't mind delivering to the local area, the only limitation being that we produce about a trailer load a week, and our trailer is about 5'x3'x3' so its not a vast quantity – but it needs to be removed, as we don't like having muck heaps.

So, to the ask for help. Could you point us in the direction of the local allotments and gardening groups to whom we could supply manure? Also just to promote our existence in the local area would be quite useful too – we're somewhat small and "untrendy" in donating terms, and every possible bit of help would be most appreciated. Although the pub successfully re-opened on Friday. Due to some heavy debts left at the pub by several people and businesses, spanning many years, I am struggling to get the correct utility companies and suppliers to deal with us without clearing debts running into tens of thousands of pounds. This is being dealt with and as soon as we can get things like gas connected for instance, we will be able to open the restaurant. As soon as these issues can be cleared up, we will open immediately but I am still unsure on when exactly this will be. In the meantime the pub is open for trading. On a more positive note the menus are now complete, as are plans for Christmas and New Year. We will be open from 12pm – 3pm Christmas Day and Boxing Day and 12pm – 3pm and 7pm – 1am New Years Eve with live music. Tickets for New Years Eve are now on sale for non-diners at £5 each (including your 1st drink). All other opening times remain unchanged. The website was due to go live at time of writing this so should be published by the time this goes to press. The web address is www.thereddoghighhalstow.co.uk. This site has details of how to book with us along with any developments and information regarding the pub. Alternatively an answer machine service has been set up on 07952136111 allowing for bookings to be made. As soon as I have any more information I will release it via every possible media. Thanks you again for your continued support and patience and in the meantime come and enjoy a drink in the pub.


Resume of the meeting held on 13 October 2010

The vacancy on the parish council was filled at last by the co-option of John Callaghan. John worked for many years in the construction industry and moved to the village nine years ago, following his two sons who settled here. In the past he has run scout groups and has also served as Vice Commodore with a local Yacht Club. In his working life he also had experience of Health & Safety issues. The Parish Councillors welcome him to the Council and look forward to the contribution he will make to local affairs. Quotations are being sought for the clearance of the end part of the allotment area, which would provide an additional allotment, although it will be an unconventional shape, and for cutting down brambles on Forge Common. The ditch on the Recreation Ground is shortly to be reconstructed. The spoil will be used to strengthen the bund on the boundary, to give extra protection from water flowing into Goodwood Close gardens during periods of heavy rain – although it is hoped that the reconstruction of the ditch will mean this will be a thing of the past.

Following the successful visit of a football cage earlier in the year, the Parish Council is investigating the cost of providing one for the Recreation Ground. An incident involving youths playing with a football in the car park was reported. Parents are reminded that ball games in the car park are prohibited, whether or not a sign to this effect is in place. In fact one of the signs has vanished and will have to be replaced. The City of Rochester Society has written, putting forward the case that in Medway Council's bid for city status, they should promote the name as "City of Rochester-upon-Medway", rather than "Medway City". The full name of Rochester reflects not only the cathedral city, but as it also contains the name of the river Medway, it flows on from "Medway Council". The Parish Council voted to support this.

The Parish Council also agreed to give a donation to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal as usual and the wreath will be laid on Remembrance Sunday, 14th November.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 10th November at 8 pm in the Memorial Hall. The Photographic Competition winners will be announced at this meeting and refreshments will be provided. Everyone is welcome.

High Halstow Cricket Club

The annual general meeting of the cricket club will be held in the Memorial Hall at 7.30 on 20th November 2010. The meeting will be followed by the presentation of annual awards. The meeting is open to all members, including colts and their parents and anyone wishing to join the club for 2011.

The 2010 season finished on a high with the 3rd XI gaining promotion to Division 1A (Central) of the Kent Regional League. The 1st XI had already been relegated but the 2nd XI secured another season in Division III (2nd XIs) of the Kent League. As reported earlier, the colts had an excellent season with the U17s and U15s winning their leagues. There was further success at the Colts League presentation when Ashley Trigg, Sam Kember, Harry Jeal, Liam Seymour and Reece Miller all won individual awards.



Dear HHT,

For those of us who drive, I'm sure we have all encountered at some time commercial vehicles using Dux Court Road usually coming from the other direction all always at the railway bridge.

The signage at both ends of Dux Court indicate a MGW (Maximum Gross Weight of 6 Tons) owing to the weak bridge, but the signs in my opinion are poorly positioned, obscured by trees & undergrowth and don't give sufficient advanced warning of this weight restriction to allow HGV drivers time to stop & take an alternative route.

For us locals who use this route we know of this restriction so use Christmas Lane or Britannia Drive, but drivers not aware of this especially delivery drivers using "Satnav" use this route without question or even bother to notice the weight restriction, purely because the satnav is indication it's the shortest route to our village it must be correct.

As an operator of commercial vehicle, it annoys me to see this short cut being abused & I have on several occasions confronted drivers, taken down their operator licence number and reported them... but by this time it's too late for them to turn around.

Yes, it is the driver's responsibility to know the weight of his vehicle & prepare his route accordingly. But it is likewise the responsibility of Medway Council / H. H. Parish Council to install, site and maintain road signs at both ends of Dux Court, this must also includes the pruning of overhanging trees and bushes. With this in mind, would it therefore be possible to have this matter on the agenda for the next Parish Council meeting.
