### Walking Doesn't Get Wetter Than That!

Nine hardy hikers turned out for our walk from Cliffe Woods despite the heavy rain and promise of worse to come, a promise that was very well fulfilled. However, everybody was dressed for the conditions and a change in route from the one planned through the woods because of the slippery woodland paths made for a safe, enjoyable and memorable 2 hours. We walked eastwards out from Cliffe Woods village initially on the roadway and then along the edge of the woods taking a detour up Lodge Hill to the now largely empty army camp. Most had not previously seen the training area for bomb-disposal or the Harrier-like plane that sits within the fenced-off area; this can all seem a bit spooky if you come across it unexpectedly from some of the paths through the woods. It was also easy for us to see the large expanse of land previously used by the army and now planned for the housing expansion of Chattenden - here's hoping the nightingales will continue to sing there on one of their most important sites in the UK. Going back down the hill we kept our distance from the enthusiasts of the woodland archery club and then took a route through the interesting and attractive hamlet of Spendiff and began our return through Cooling Street and Perry Hill in increasingly poor conditions. Most of us decided to dry out (well in one way) in a very welcome and well deserved visit to the Horseshoes and Castle at Cooling.

The November walk will be from Ightham Moat on SATURDAY 9th to avoid Remembrance Day on the Sunday. The start is from the National Trust car park at the Moat (TN15 0NT). This is £2 for parking (unless NT member) and is best reached by taking the A227 beyond Borough Green, shortly after which Ightham Moat is well sign-posted. From High Halstow it is about a 45minute drive. Once parked we will meet adjacent to the entrance to the Moat. The walk has some steep parts and can be slippery if wet so please wear suitable footwear. It is advisable to bring walking poles/sticks.

# Estuary Airport Proposals and 'Other Things'

Whilst we await the airports commission listing of airport proposals for the SouthEast at the end of 2013, readers may also like to be aware of the N.A.T.S. (National Air Traffic Services), London Airspace Consultation, which has recently commenced on the 15th October and runs until 21st January 2014. The consultation appears to include flight path changes above our area for London City and Southend Airports, and is open for comment on the website.

This consultation is the first stage in a wider programme of proposed changes to deliver the UK's Future Airspace Strategy (FAS), developed by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) with the support of the aviation industry. It will deliver significant benefits, including fuel savings for airlines, which will also mean fewer CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, and less noise overall for people living below.

Aircraft today use very accurate navigation technology and new European legislation requires all member States, including the UK, to revise airspace and maximise the use of these new technologies. Change is therefore inevitable and the focus of this consultation is on how best to enable that change.

After listening to feedback from previous consultations, this consultation is on swathes of airspace – not on proposed routes. The final route positions will only be determined after consideration of the feedback from the consultation.

The new design concept being implemented for this programme, making the most of new navigation capability, will also significantly reduce the use of conventional holds (or stacks), and put new route structures over the sea where possible.

The net effect of these proposals will be less noise — aircraft will climb higher, more quickly on departure and stay higher for longer on arrival. Flight paths will eventually change — and this may mean some areas will be overflown more than today, others less, and some will not notice any significant change.

For Gatwick routes, the consultation is being run jointly by NATS and Gatwick Airport, with Gatwick leading consultation on changes below 4,000ft, and NATS on changes above 7,000ft. Consultation on changes planned for airspace between 4,000 and 7,000ft will be managed jointly. NATS is leading the consultation on the intermediate and network airspace proposals for the other airports; London City is not yet in a position to proceed with low level change proposals, which will be subject to a future consultation.

Later stages will address proposals for airspace supporting other parts of the London airports network, to be complete by 2020.

The postcode search facility and clickable maps with consultation areas clearly marked makes it easy to see which proposed changes have the most relevance to a specific location. Feedback can be given directly on the website.


