

#### RUTH

This is a story of love and loyalty. Naomi, a Jewish woman, is forced to flee, with her husband Elimelech and their two young sons, from Israel to the foreign land of Moab to escape a terrible famine. The boys grow up and marry Moabite women, Ruth and Orpah. Disaster strikes when first Naomi's husband and then her two sons die. Ruth, however, is an exceptional person who stands by her mother-in-law, when she decides to return to her homeland, to Bethlehem.

As the story unfolds we see how a combination of love, loyalty and Jewish law (designed to protect the poor and destitute through family ties) all lead to a conclusion which had a profound effect on the history of the world.

There are one or two Jewish customs which may puzzle modern audiences:

- Poor people were allowed to 'glean' or collect the fallen grain which was left after the harvesters had cleared the fields.
- We hear reference to a 'kinsman redeemer'. This is a relative of the
  deceased who volunteers to take responsibility for the extended
  family. A woman could marry a brother of the dead husband or the
  nearest relative and would become the 'kinsman redeemer'.
- And finally, property deals in Israel were sealed and legalised by one party handing over his sandal to the other.
