

High Halstow Mums set up a new baby and toddler group

On Thursday 28th February 2019 High Halstow Stay and Play opened its doors for the first time, welcoming local children and their families to play at the village hall.

As mums in High Halstow with new babies, we were disappointed to find there were no groups running here for us to attend... so early on in the new year we decided to take it upon ourselves to change that!

Being on maternity leave, we didn't have the funds to set up ourselves so we applied to the High Halstow Community Lottery for a start up grant. We were very excited when we received the email to say our application had been approved and we set about organising straight away!

We put a Facebook appeal out to local residents for donations of toys, and soon we had bags and boxes of toys being dropped off and collected all around the village!

As we write this, we have so far had 3 sessions. It has been so lovely for us to see so many children coming to enjoy themselves with their grown ups, and we have received some lovely feedback.

We would like to say a big thank you to everyone who has supported us with this venture, and particularly to the High Halstow Community Lottery who enabled us to get up and running!

We are really hoping the group will continue to be well attended and will be a great resource for local families for years to come.

The weather at the beginning of March including on the day for our walk was exceptionally windy. So it was with some nervousness that we approached the woods of Trosley Country Park perched as it is on the top of the North Downs for our start – I cannot remember our group



walking on a stormier day. But while it could hardly be called calm the trees helped to shelter us and the wind was blowing along the park rather than up the downs. The underfoot conditions were a greater challenge with some of the paths on our route being puddle-filled and slippery. So while we had aimed to include a loop around Harvel the 15 of us cut back on the length of the walk and spent most of our time on either the North Downs Way and the Wealdway. The clear views to the South through the viewing gaps along the main path through the park were as lovely as ever. The coffee in the visitor centre at the end of the 2 hours was very welcome for the slightly weather-beaten hikers.

In April the walk will be on Sunday 14thand will be around the tops of the Downs above Wye (near Ashford). The walk of between 6 and 7 miles will start at 10.00 from the Wye Downs Car Park off Coldharbour Lane. The nearest post code is for a nearby farm, TN25 5HX. This Car Park serves the nearby Devil's Kneading Trough, a spectacular bowl-like cleft in the Downs.


