Petition by neighbours regarding Planning Application

MC/19/0988 Construction of 8 residential dwelling houses 6 x two bed and 2 x three bed with associated landscaping and parking with new vehicular access (demolition of existing buildings) 51-57 The Street High Halstow Rochester Medway ME3 8SJ

MHS homes have applied for planning permission to demolish a property they own on a small parcel of land in The Street. The property comprises of 4 maisonettes which will be demolished to make way for 8 new houses.

This potential development has been considered for some time with an initial enquiry to High Halstow Parish Council for its views on the new development. The Parish Council voted against the idea. Nevertheless, MHS still went ahead with an application to build the 8 new houses.

The following are just a few of the objections put forward by residents:

- Access and egress to the properties will be from and to the narrowest part The Street and thus will create traffic issues.
- There is certainly loss of privacy to present neighbours as the residents in Goodwood close reside in bungalows and therefore any 2-storey property would allow residents to see into residents' homes in Goodwood close.
- The 2-storey homes will deprive the residents of Goodwood close with daylight and sunlight.
- Existing natural features, such as trees, which contribute to the amenity of the area will be destroyed and removed. The plan shows this.
- The application expresses 8 units, 2 of which will be family sized. On such a small piece of land these dwellings would have to be far too small to accommodate 8 dwellings.



- The Council have already raised amenity concerns.
- The issue raised by Medway Council at pre-application was that policy H9 of the Local Plan restricts back land development where it would have an adverse impact on the character and amenity of an area or the amenity of neighbouring residents
- This development will set a president for future developments.
- The access is certainly an issue and is too close to the primary school and could prove dangerous.

If you also have concerns on this application, please contact Medway Council Planning Department, either online or by writing to Dave Harris, Planning Officer to raise your objections.

Letter

To answer the question raised by Bill Khatkar on Facebook, regarding the loan from the Parish Council let me put the record straight once again to you. The Parish Council did not loan the Village Hall Committee £30,000 which hasn't been paid back. The Parish Council however did loan the Village Hall Committee £90,000 which was all paid back in the same year it was lent. As explained before at the time the money was lent, this was due to the fact the Village Hall Committee had to pay builders for work carried for the refurbishment prior to the funders providing the grant. This was a grant stipulation and as the Village Hall clearly did not have this money to pay the builder up front the Parish Council stepped in to help.

The loan referred to is a loan the Village Hall Committee have but this is not from the Parish Council

I am disappointed Bill that you also believe the hall is not value for money and surprised you think that the organisations providing grants had such poor control on their funds. The whole process was costed independently before work undertaken, as well as ensuring all necessary planning permissions were sought **before** works were carried out. To say we have nothing to show for it is a slur on past and current Hall Committee members and the community as a whole who have worked tirelessly over the years to see the Hall improved from the state it was in to probably the best community facility on the peninsula. If you have specific queries I would be happy to answer.

In terms of seeing the dead wood replaced from the Parish Council I would also suggest that clearly this process started in May just gone.



High Halstow Hikers

Our June walk took a circular route of about 5 miles around High Halstow along paths that are well-used and familiar to most but nonetheless provide very attractive views around the surrounding countryside. We were very fortunate to have a lovely warm and largely sunny day for the walk given that for several days either side there had was heavy rain. It was also great to be joined by several new faces so that we had 18 walkers despite a few regulars not being able to make it.

The route took us from the village hall across the recreation ground to the footpath across the fields that meets Britannia Road close to its junction with Clinch Street. We walked up the latter before taking

the Saxon Shore Way to Forge Common and through the bird reserve to Bromhey Farm and up the gentle hill to Eastborough bungalow. The farm track to the east from there follows a ridge that provides good underfoot conditions throughout the year and, on a day as clear as the one we walked on, views across the countryside to the Thames and the local villages that are difficult to better. The appearance of the fields with shades of green due the ripening crops was just as lovely as we returned to the village through Wybournes Farm. All in all, a terrific 2.5 hour walk that was enjoyed by all.

Our next walk will be on SATURDAY 13th July we will walk to the strip on shingle on the shore of the Thames just to east of St Mary's Bay to hopefully cook our brunch on the beach. To do this we will leave St Mary Hoo (ME3 8RH) after parking in Hall Road at 10.00. The walk is just over 2 miles each way. So long as the weather is OK we will spend about an hour on the beach.
