#### High Halstow Hikers

Our February walk was planned to be mainly around Knole Park but unfortunately had to be cancelled a couple of days beforehand as it became clear that Storm Ciara was going to make things hazardous. As it turns out Knole Park was closed as a precaution against the extreme conditions. While we have experienced all weathers this was just the third walk to be cancelled since our first in October 2010.

In the absence of a walk to report I thought I might record a few facts about those we have completed over what is approaching 10 years. Nineteen of the 105 weekend, usually Sunday walks have started from High



Halstow and another 20 from elsewhere on the Hoo Peninsula with several around the Cliffe Marshes and Pools. We have visited Greenwich Park and the river twice (including walking through the tunnel under it) and taken the train to central London to walk the Thames footpath and on another memorable sunny Summer Sunday around the Royal Parks. Otherwise almost all the walks have involved a 30-60 minute drive to other parts of Kent although we did go as far as the Cuckmere Valley near the Seven Sisters on two occasions that were well worth the drive. We have had 3 trips that involved one or more night's stay and allowed more than one walk: to Rye, Snettisham near Kings Lynn and last year's very enjoyable 3 nights near Chatsworth in the Peak District.

The most we have had on a walk is just over 30 and the fewest was 5 (hardy souls) with most involving between 15 and 20. We generally walk for around 2.5 hours and try to take non-challenging routes of 5-7 miles. It is not infrequent for some of us to take a pint plus or minus a pub lunch after the walk.

While some of our walkers have been involved for most of the ten years there have also been many changes with people moving away, becoming less mobile or in a few sad instances passing away. Those departures have been more than balanced by others coming along. I almost said "joining", but that implies some form of membership and we are in fact a very informal group: one that gathers to enjoy some exercise in the open air but mainly to share good company - many new strong friendships have developed as a result. If you fancy taking part you can just turn up on the day. #### **Doorstep Crime - Tree cutting services**

There have been recent reports that doorstep criminals are active in the East Peckham area - all Kent residents should be on alert.

#### What happens:


- Residents are cold-called for tree cutting work
- Exorbitant sums of money are demanded
- The criminals drive the resident to the bank to withdraw cash

#### What to do

- NEVER agree to work being carried out from someone who knocks on your door uninvited
- Don't allow anyone to pressure you into having work done
- If you ask them to leave and they don't, contact the police on 999
- Use reputable traders who are members of the KCC Trading Standards approved trader scheme, run in partnership with Checkatrade
- Get a minimum of 3 quotes in writing
- Warn vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours.
- Report it


#### May Smitherman

Winter is truly upon us and we all need to take responsibility and care when moving around the village and using the variety of public roads, paths and amenity sites. Whilst some roads within the village are gritted this is not guaranteed and we should all remember that most footways are not gritted, so extra care should be taken on particularly cold days.

We would like to remind parishioners that they have a responsibility to make sure their vegetation does not obstruct a public right of way, footway or road, that any gravel driveway overspill is regularly cleared from footways and that they are considerate to all other highway and footway users in the way they park and manoeuvre.
