High Halstow Macmillan Coffee Morning.



If you are not already in the lottery it's not too late to join. The cost to play is £10 per ticket per month. However, more than one ticket can be bought by requesting the bank to set up the standing order for £20 for two tickets or £30 for three tickets etc. You can buy a one off ticket or set up a monthly standing order payment as follows;

To be eligible for this mega draw your payment will need to be showing in our bank account by the last banking day in November.

In 3 years the lottery has given out over £50,000 in prize money.


It has also funded over £9,000 towards High Halstow Community Projects. These projects include 3 different payments to the Primary School, the Cricket Club, WI, Memorial Hall, Poppies on Lamp posts, new Toddlers group, St Margaret's Church window restoration etc.

High Halstow Hikers

The weather at the beginning of October was very wet to the extent that we nearly cancelled the walk but eventually a small group of us did a slightly sticky but otherwise dry and enjoyable circular 2hour, 5 mile walk from Teston Bridge Country Park. The River Medway runs alongside the park and at this point there is an attractive lock and weir. It was no surprise that on our visit the river was in spate and racing over the weir to create a cover of white foam. Our route took us along the riverbank to Wateringbury passing a herd of shaggy Hebridean cattle that have been introduced to maintain the wet meadow environment. A long string of moored boats stretched over several hundred yards on the bank of the river closest to us with occasional owners tending to them or simply relaxing and having a Sunday morning cuppa watching the wildfowl coasting with the flow.

After crossing the bridge at Wateringbury the footpath to the south of the river moves slowly away from the bank and to give great views to the north towards the impressive Barham Court as we gently climbed to Tutsham Hall Farm. This is one of the tidiest farms imaginable having been converted and upgraded to many lovely dwellings and serviced by a helicopter while still remaining a working farm. From the farm we walked through nearby fields carefully selecting a few large field mushrooms to take home to eat before tracking through the small attractive village of West Farleigh. The footpath from there runs alongside the road to Maidstone and in places the traffic made walking a little uncomfortable before we turned off to pass through the cricket field with its lovely thatched pavilion at Court Lodge. The way back to the cars took us over the 14/15th century bridge with its multiple small passing places to give walkers sanctuary from the single-file traffic over the river before we shared refreshments at the small hut in the car park. It would have been nice to have better conditions but this varied walk was very enjoyable nonetheless.

Our next walk will start at 10.00 on SATURDAY 9th November (to avoid Remembrance Sunday) from the Prince of Wales Pond on the south side of Blackheath (SE3 0RY). Parking is available on South Row which runs along the edge of the pond. The walk has been chosen partly because we can guarantee good underfoot conditions despite it being November but mainly because the walk across the Heath, through Greenwich Park and along the river is through some of the most iconic maritime sites in the world. The walk will be about 4-5 miles long and as ever all are welcome with any queries to Mitchell on 01634 254428 or mitch.dowsett@btopenworld.com.


